WHO: Department of Public Works

WHAT: Richmond E-Cycle Day for City of Richmond Residents

- **Paper Document Shredding**
 - Up to five (5) boxes of paper documents. Be sure to remove all binders, staples and clips
- **Electronics (various fees)**
 - Computer systems (hard drive or CPU) and accessories (cables, wires, keyboards, mice, speakers, etc.)
 - VCRs, camcorders, stereos and all phones
 - Televisions, computer monitors and printers

WHEN: Saturday, May 8 from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.

WHERE: [NEW Location] Broad Rock Sports Complex, 4825 Old Warwick Rock Road (23224)

All residents must:

- Wear a face covering, stay in their car and roll the windows down
- Note: volunteers will get electronics and/or shredding items out of your car

BACKGROUND: The City of Richmond's *E-Cycle Day* offers City residents an efficient option to recycle paper and electronics to help keep them out of the landfill and recycled properly. This event is available to city residents – proof of residency is required.
