Utility Rates Effective July 1, 2021

The City of Richmond Department of Public Utilities announces utility rate changes adopted by Richmond City Council, effective July 1, 2021. These rate increases are projected to cost the average utility customer approximately \$5.30 more per month which equates to less than a three percent increase.

Utility	Rate Increase	Average Increase *
Natural Gas	2.75%	\$1.50
Water	2.50%	\$0.92
Wastewater	4.00%	\$2.48
Stormwater	8.75%	\$0.36

^{*}Monthly average increase assumes natural gas usage of 70 Ccf; water/wastewater usage of 6 Ccf; and stormwater parcel categorized in Tier 2 (impervious surface between 1,001 and 2,000 sq. ft.)
