WHAT IS THE CITIZENS POLICE ACADEMY? This **FREE** Citizens Police Academy is designed to introduce citizens to the RPD, improve relationships with RPD, help participants gain knowledge of police operations, develop stronger advocates and promote safety in the community. Sessions will include, but not be limited to: RPD patrol functions, crime prevention through environmental design, personal safety, hands-on exercises, tours within the Richmond Police Department and so much more.

WHO MAY ATTEND? The Academy is perfect for persons interested in a career in law enforcement or who want to learn about the law enforcement profession. Citizens are expected to attend and participate in at least 80% of the sessions.

WHAT HAPPENS AFTER GRADUATION? Graduates of the Citizens Police Academy officially become Volunteers in Police Services (VIPS). Members of VIPS are notified of volunteer opportunities, events, special programs and services with RPD. Graduates may be also called to participate on special boards and planning committees.

NEVER LEAVE YOUR PERSONAL PROPERTY UNATTENDED

The Richmond Police Department in cooperation with your local area restaurants want you to be aware and give you some simple tips to prevent being a victim of crime:

- ❖ Don't leave belongings such as bags and laptop computers unattended.
- ❖ Place items out of sight in the trunk of your vehicle *prior* to reaching your destination. Never leave packages in the passenger compartment unattended.
- ❖ Carry your purse close to your body. Never wrap the strap around your body.
- ❖ When in a restaurant, don't leave your handbag over the back of a chair or stool.
- ❖ Carry your wallet in the breast pocket of your jacket or in your front pants pocket. The back pocket is the easiest to pick.
