Greetings,  
March has seen a reduction in violent crime in Sector 312; violent crime has decreased 58%, 12 crimes in 2017 compared to five crimes 2018.

We still had:  
Two - Robbery of individuals  
Three - Aggravated assaults

Property crime increased from 81 to 87 for a 7% increase compared to the same time last year. The biggest increase in property crimes was in thefts of motor vehicles, shoplifting and thefts of motor vehicle parts, sector-wide. The majority of the stolen vehicles were left running to warm up. We are still seeing thefts from vehicles where the doors were left unlocked and the items left in plain view.

Things we can all do to prevent thefts from motor vehicles:

- \* Lock your car doors;
- \* Never leave valuables in your vehicle;
- \* Do not leave coins in the open, and;
- \* Report anything suspicious to the police.

Things we can all do to prevent auto thefts:

- \* Remember to lock your car, and;
- \* Never leave it running.

In addition to making your property a difficult target the most effective deterrent to these crimes is an active community.

- ▣ Put valuables in the trunk.

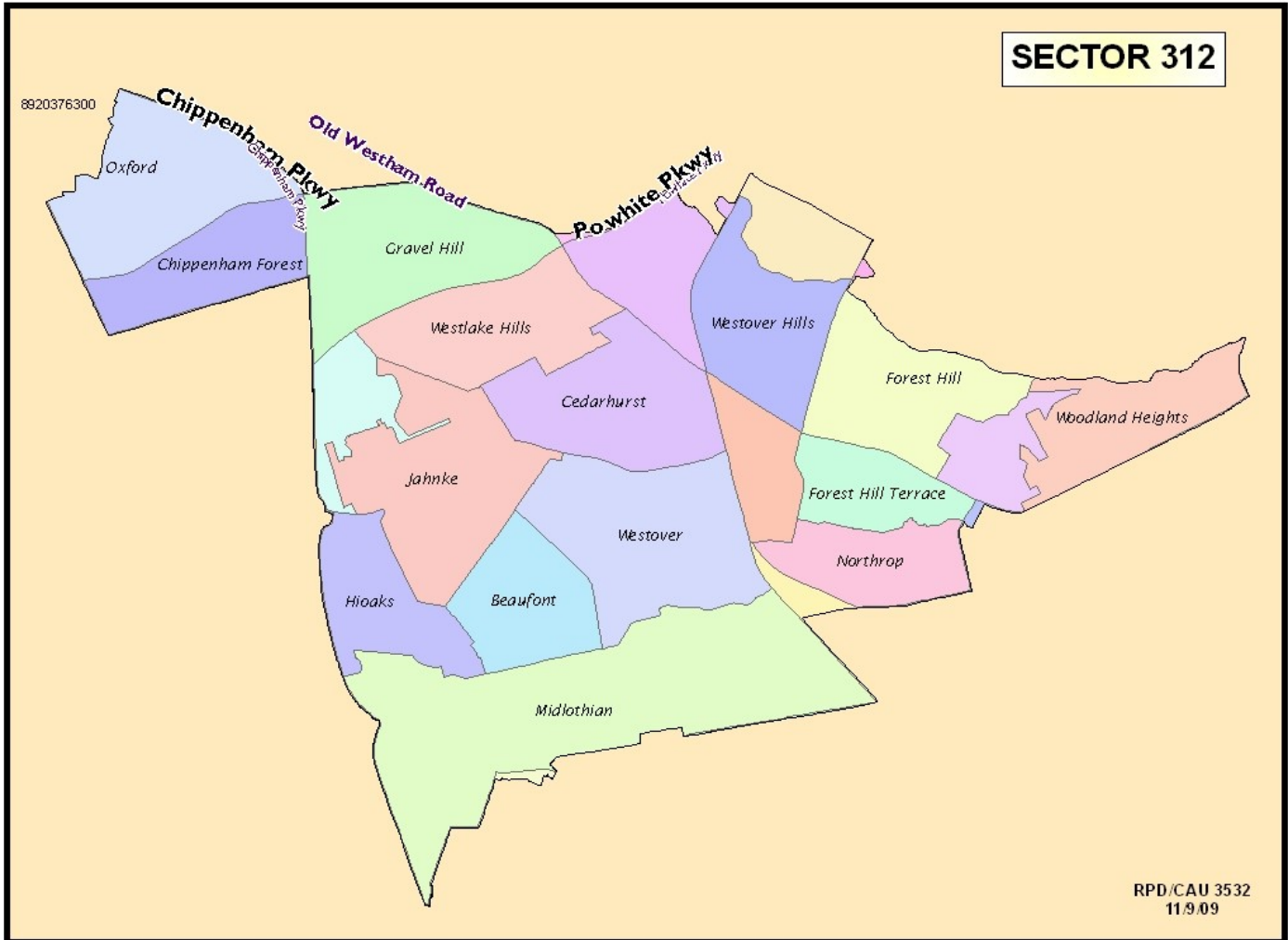
## Suggestions to help prevent robberies
