Greetings,

The month of June has seen an increase in violent crime in Sector 312. Violent crime has increased 14%: seven crimes in 2017 compared to eight crimes 2018. We had:

- 1 - Rape - known suspect
- 1 - Robbery - commercial house - arrest made
- 4 - Aggravated assaults - arrest made in one case
- 2- Domestic aggravated assaults - arrest made in both cases

Property crime decreased from 91 to 90 for a 2% decrease compared to the same time last year. The biggest increase in property crimes was in thefts from motor vehicles. Out of the 22 we had, 19 had been left unlocked with items left in plain view. We had an increase in motor vehicle thefts, ten compared with two last year in the same time period. Seven of those had the keys left in the vehicle.

Safety hints and tips.



Personal Safety:

- Always be alert and aware of your surroundings!
- Avoid suspicious situations or people and notify the police. Trust your instincts!
- Walk briskly and with confidence
- Take a friend or family member with you when shopping
- Walk against traffic to observe approaching vehicles
- Stay away from unlit or overgrown areas that provide hiding places for criminals
- Do not overdress or wear valuables in areas with which you are unfamiliar
- If using an ATM at night, find a highly visible well-lit ATM
- Do not carry or display large amounts of cash
- Try to keep valuables in your front pockets to reduce theft
- Try not to carry a purse but if you do, keep it closed and close to your body
- Do not place your purse in a shopping cart
- Keep your credit card number concealed from strangers when using it
- Try to stay at least arms length away from strangers
- Do not overburden yourself with packages
- Be wary of people trying to scam money by using guilt
- Stay sober enough to protect yourself, criminals target intoxicated people
- If shopping with kids monitor them and make sure they know what to do if lost
- Don't hesitate to run somewhere safe. It's better to be safe than sorry!

Vehicle Safety:

- Keep your doors locked while driving
- If someone attempts to enter your vehicle drive away
- Always park in a highly visible well lit area
- When going to your car keep an eye out for anyone suspicious near your vehicle
- Criminals target people getting in and out of vehicles
- Have your keys ready when you approach your vehicle
- Do not leave valuables in your car, especially in plain sight!
- If you place valuables in your car, but have not finished shopping, move your car
- Make sure your car alarm is on and use the panic button if you need to
- Do not leave personal ID's or financial documents in your vehicle
- Never leave your car running and unattended

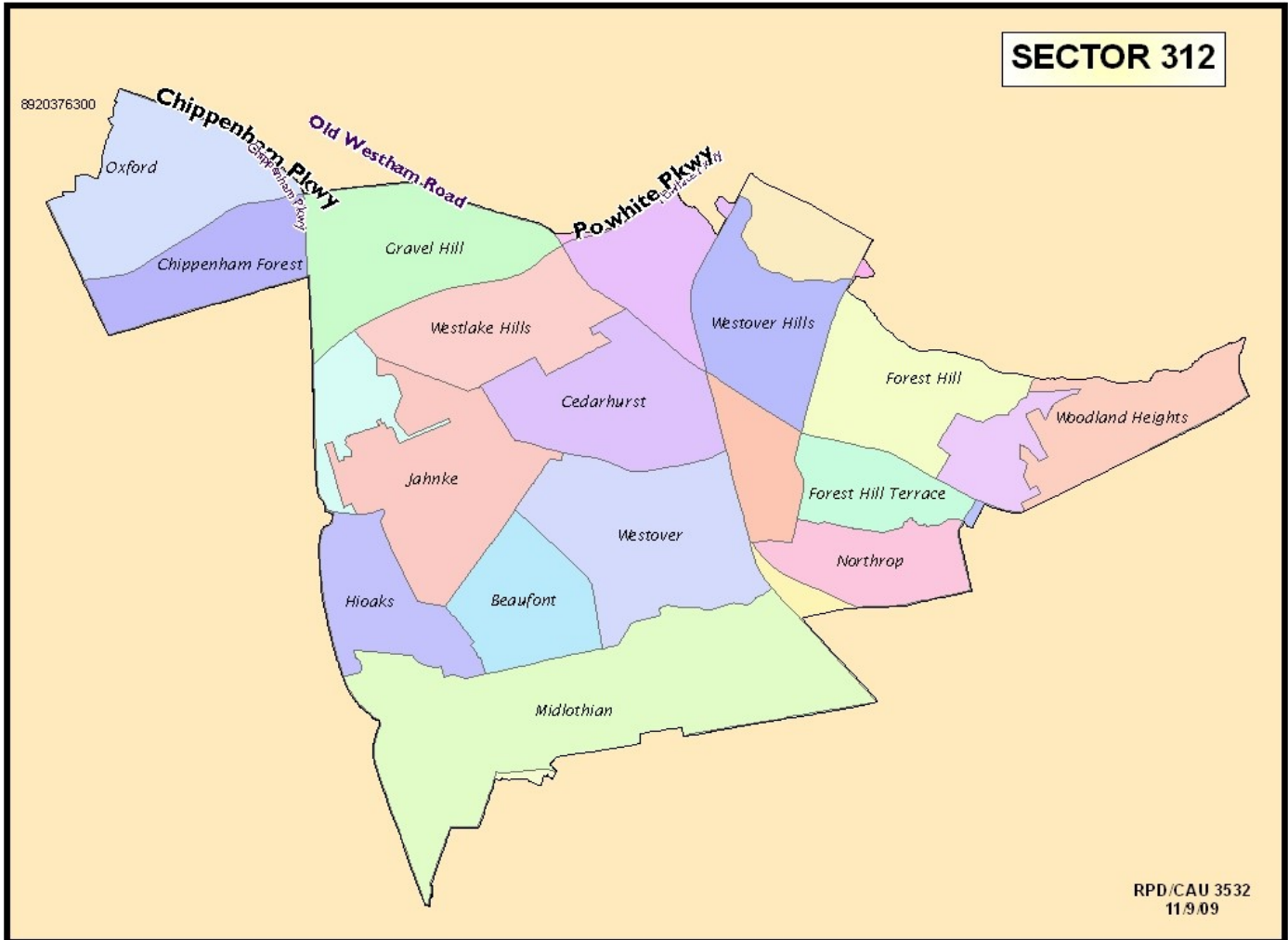
