Violent crime has remained the same over the past 28 days in comparison to this time last year. Sector 211 had one homicide that occurred in the 3900 block of Hull Street and six aggravated assaults.

Property crimes have decreased by 17%. Theft from motor vehicles and motor vehicle thefts are both down. Our most recent trend is theft of HVAC units and copper—with most occurring to houses under renovation. Please call us if you see any suspicious persons or work vehicles.



The neighborhoods of Swansboro, Broad Rock and Reedy Creek have had 15 of these thefts this year. The thieves target vacant homes that are for sale and homes that are under construction. The thefts often occur in the early morning hours, but a few have happened in the late afternoon or early evening. Once the thieves steel the perfectly good AC units or copper it is then sold for scrap.
