Nextdoor.com is an excellent way for all of us to communicate and discuss the issues that effect our sector. Plus, it gives me the understanding of the needs of the neighborhoods, and I can present strategies at the community meetings. Always feel free to ask questions or point out concerns with your neighbors by using Nextdoor. I recently posted a message on Nextdoor to all the neighborhoods in the sector. The message stated: If you plan on going out of town for an extended amount of time, please stop by the precinct and fill out a House Watch form. This will be given to the patrol units so they can keep an eye on your residence while you are out of town. The form will give the officers the days that you'll be gone and any additional information needed to conduct the house watch.

On September 25 I hosted a Command Staff Community Walk. The walk was done in the Rosedale neighborhood. The command staff and representatives from other agencies all met in the 3600 block of Rosedale Avenue. We split into four teams and walked on four different streets. We passed out fliers from the police department as well as fliers from Richmond Public Schools. The flier from the RPD advised about keeping your house and vehicles locked and secured. It also referenced residents to call the police on any suspicious activity or people. It was very refreshing to speak with all the residents in the neighborhood.

Also, I am pleased to announce that Councilman Chris Hilbert is hosting a Northside Community Resource Fair. It's being held 5 – 7 p.m., Thursday, Oct 25, at the North Ave Library Branch, 2901 North Ave. There will be vendors from the community as well as other city services. There will be refreshments provided.

I've included a 30-day chart that reflects the crime in Sector 412 for the past 30 days compared to last year at the same period. As you can see we've had a great 30 days. I thank all in the sector for making our sector such a great place to live and work.

I've included a flier that points out some tips on keeping your deliveries and packages safe. Make sure to keep your homes and your vehicles locked and secured. Place all items that will be left in your vehicle in your trunk area, out of plain view. Never leave your vehicle unattended and running as that only invites criminal activity. This seems to be an on-going problem. Remember don't be a victim - we can all do this together.

### **NEVER LEAVE YOUR PERSONAL PROPERTY UNATTENDED**

The Richmond Police Department in cooperation with your local area restaurants want you to be aware and give you some simple tips to prevent being a victim of crime:

- ❖ Don't leave belongings such as bags and laptop computers unattended.
- ❖ Place items out of sight in the trunk of your vehicle *prior* to reaching your destination. Never leave packages in the passenger compartment unattended.
- ❖ Carry your purse close to your body. Never wrap the strap around your body.
- ❖ When in a restaurant, don't leave your handbag over the back of a chair or stool.
- ❖ Carry your wallet in the breast pocket of your jacket or in your front pants pocket. The back pocket is the easiest to pick.
