Public Meeting to Detail Pedestrian Improvements at Un-Signalized Intersections

~Vision Zero 2020 plans to improve roadway safety for people who walk ~

RICHMOND, Va. – The Department of Public Works will hold a public meeting to review project plans to improve roadway safety for pedestrians on Thursday, December 19 from 5 to 7 p.m. at the Richmond Main Library, located at 101 East Franklin Street. Residents will learn about proposed pedestrian safety improvements, to include enhanced crosswalks, pavement markings, and signage. These enhancements will be made at more than 150 un-signalized intersections throughout the City, focusing on intersections identified in VDOT's Pedestrian Safety Action Plan.

The project team, including representatives from the City of Richmond and consultants from Kimley-Horn and Associates, will be available to answer questions.
