Following the release of the 2020 U.S. Census data in the fall of 2021, Richmond City Council embarked upon an eight month process of selecting new voter districts. This process, which involved an unprecedented amount of public input, was completed on June 27, 2022.

Following the completion of City Council approving new voter districts, my office began the process of adjusting the precincts and districts of voters within the state voter registration database system known as VERIS. This process involved not just moving some voters into new local precincts, but also moving all voters into new legislative districts that corresponded with the state redistricting map that was finalized in December 2021.

This process was just completed recently, and all voters have now been moved into their correct districts and precincts. My office has received notification from the Virginia Department of Elections that redistricting notices will go out to every registered voter in the City Of Richmond this week.

It is extremely important that every voter pays close attention to their mail over the next several days. This redistricting notice will provide every voter with information regarding their new state senate and house of delegate districts, and if applicable, their new council districts and their new polling places.

There was no change to our congressional boundary lines. The city of Richmond is still wholly contained within the 4th Congressional District.
