These notices shall satisfy two separate but related procedural requirements for activities to be undertaken by the City of Richmond.

REQUEST FOR RELEASE OF FUNDS

On or about September 24, 2024 the City of Richmond will submit a request to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), Richmond Field Office, Community Planning and Development Division, for the release of HOME funds under Title II of the Cranston-Gonzalez National Affordable Housing Act of 1990, as amended, to undertake a project known as Lafayette Gardens Apartments. The proposed project is to be located at 2209 Ruffin Road in Richmond, Virginia. The proposed project will include the interior and exterior rehabilitation of the existing 1-, 2-, and 3-bedroom apartments and the conversion of the existing community room and leasing office contained within Building 2219 into two new apartment units for a total of 104 multi-family housing units among 13 buildings. Additionally, the existing maintenance and laundry building will be demolished and replaced with a new freestanding community building in the same location that also provides a leasing office as well as laundry and maintenance facilities. Furthermore, the project will include the relocation of the existing playground and replacement with new playground equipment. New landscaping will be planted at the front and rear of the existing buildings and at the new community building. Finally, Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) compliance improvements will be completed for the apartment community's exterior amenities and within all accessible apartment units. The estimated value of the HOME funds is \$250,000. The total estimated project cost is \$24,717,174 (inclusive of HUD and non-HUD funds).

FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT

The City of Richmond has determined that the project will have no significant impact on the human environment. Therefore, an Environmental Impact Statement under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (NEPA) is not required. ENVIRONMENTAL CERTIFICATION

The City of Richmond certifies to HUD that Mr. J.E. Lincoln Saunders, in his capacity as Chief Administrative Officer, consents to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal Courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to the environmental review process and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. HUD's approval of the certification satisfies its responsibilities under NEPA and related laws and authorities and allows Canterbury Enterprises to use Program funds.

OBJECTIONS TO RELEASE OF FUNDS

HUD will accept objections to its release of funds and the City of Richmond's certification for a period of fifteen days following the anticipated submission date or its actual receipt of the request (whichever is later) only if they are on one of the following bases: (a) the certification was not executed by the Certifying Officer of the City of Richmond; (b) the City of Richmond has omitted a step or failed to make a decision or finding required by HUD regulations at 24 CFR part 58; (c) the grant recipient or other participants in the project have committed funds, incurred costs or undertaken activities not authorized by 24 CFR Part 58 before approval of a release of funds by HUD; or (d) another Federal agency acting pursuant to 40 CFR Part 1504 has submitted a written finding that the project is unsatisfactory from the standpoint of environmental quality.
