We've seen a decrease in crime the last 28 days in our sector compared to the previous 28 days. We saw a 71% decrease in people shot, 50% decrease in aggravated assaults, 36% decrease in all violent crimes, 63% decrease in burglaries, and 15% decrease in all property crimes. We experienced a 20% decrease in all major crimes. Thefts from motor vehicles remain an issue. Please remember to lock your doors and remove any valuable items from your vehicles.



NEW NEXTDOOR FEATURE

We have enabled a new feature on Nextdoor that will be helpful when a Nextdoor user wishes to share crime and safety messages with the RPD. As you probably know – when folks on Nextdoor use this site to discuss neighborhood issues – the Richmond Police Department cannot see the discussion – even when the comments involve an urgent alert or crime and safety.

Until now, we could only be notified when we received a direct message from someone on Nextdoor. But now – Nextdoor has offered a new feature, **Forward to Police**. Each time someone starts a post on Nextdoor in the Crime and Safety or Urgent Alert categories, that person will be offered a Forward to Police option. If clicked, your message will be sent to the sector lieutenant for your area - or other Department designee. This way we can be advised of crime and safety issues in your neighborhood more quickly!
