Preventing Burglaries

When you see someone suspicious in your neighborhood call our non-emergency number (804) 646-5100 and notify the police immediately.

Look into investing into a security alarm system. A less expensive option is purchasing a yard sign, DIY security system or cameras (see examples below).

Please remember to lock your windows and doors. Also do not leave tools, lawnmowers and other yard equipment outside.





The most common crime in the city is theft from unlocked motor vehicles— PLEASE LOCK YOUR CARS!

Obvious items such as purses, cell phones, iPads, laptops, and electronics are all being stolen. But thieves are also taking items such as sweatshirts, coins, cigarettes, and car chargers. Reduce the opportunity for theft from vehicles.

- Park in well-lighted areas
- Park in well-traveled areas
- Lock your doors
- Do not leave valuables in the car
- Mark or slash inspection stickers and city decals
- Put valuables in the trunk
- Do not use your glove box as a safe
- Do not leave coins in plain view
