This month, we are walking in the Six Points area of Richmond's North Side. Six Points is wonderful part of our city. There has been a lot of investment in the area and we are making great strides in crime reduction so far in 2018. Sector 411 year-to-date, as compared to the same period in 2017, has seen the following reductions:

- A 45 percent reduction in all violent crimes (40 crimes in 2017 vs. 22 crimes in 2018)
- A 27 percent reduction in all property crimes, including an incredible 73 percent reduction in residential burglaries!

There is one crime where we are still struggling, particularly in the area around Six Points. Motor vehicle thefts are up 5 percent from this time period last year. Almost all of these stolen cars are taken from unlocked cars with the keys in them - many times, the cars are still running.

As a community, we can do better, however we don't have all the answers. Please let us know if you have ideas on how we can help make this neighborhood a safer place to live. - Lt. Rick Edwards

RPD and ATF offering a reward related to the shooting at 5th Ave/Pollock St

The shooting happened in the 3200 block of 5th Ave near Pollock St on Saturday Sept. 9, 2017 at 10:20pm.

Three young males shot at a residence on 5th Ave. There were several children on the porch and a <mark>9 year old girl was shot</mark>. The shooters then ran down Pollock St and shot and killed Victor Harris as he was riding his bike. The shooters got into a small black sedan parked on the 3300 block of 4th Ave. Harris was just getting home from work at Dunn's BBQ where he worked for 30 years.
