New "Bus Only" travel lanes are now also in effect. Please drive safely and pay attention to new street patterns. Also, please pay attention to the new travel lanes.

I have also included a flyer that lists several tips on keeping deliveries and packages safe. Please make sure to keep your homes and your vehicles locked and secured. ## ***DON'T BE A VICTIM***

### **NEVER LEAVE YOUR PERSONAL PROPERTY UNATTENDED**

The Richmond Police Department in cooperation with your local area restaurants want you to be aware and give you some simple tips to prevent being a victim of crime:

- ❖ Don't leave belongings such as bags and laptop computers unattended.
- ❖ Place items out of sight in the trunk of your vehicle *prior* to reaching your destination. Never leave packages in the passenger compartment unattended.
- ❖ Carry your purse close to your body. Never wrap the strap around your body.
- ❖ When in a restaurant, don't leave your handbag over the back of a chair or stool.
- ❖ Carry your wallet in the breast pocket of your jacket or in your front pants pocket. The back pocket is the easiest to pick.
