## **City to Hold Virtual Meetings for Input on Gillies Creek Trail Phases II and III**

**RICHMOND, Va.** – The Richmond Department of Public Works (DPW) is currently designing a shared-use trail along Gillies Creek Park. The trail is intended to be located from Williamsburg Avenue to Jennie Scher Road. It is part of a larger trail network that is envisioned to connect the Virginia Capital Trail to a north side mixed-income redevelopment at Armstrong High School. The design will include safe pedestrian crossings at existing roadway intersections.

City residents will have an opportunity to review the proposed designs and provide feedback.
