

PUBLIC NOTICE CITY OF RICHMOND 2022-2023 ANNUAL ACTION PLAN

In accordance with HUD citizen participation requirements, a 30-day public comment period for the proposed 2022-2023 Annual Action Plan (City Fiscal Year 2023, HUD Program Year 2022) will begin on May 23, 2022, and will expire on June 24, 2022. By this notice, the City of Richmond announces the availability of the 2022-2023 Annual Action Plan of the 2021-2025 Five-Year Consolidated Plan is ready for public review and comment.

Notice is also hereby given that the Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) will hold a public hearing on Thursday, June 9, 2022, at 6:00 pm at 1500 E. Main Street, 1st floor of Main Street Station. Citizens and interested persons are invited to give their views regarding the use of CDBG, HOME, ESG and HOPWA funds for the proposed Annual Action Plan. The City will arrange for reasonable accommodations for non-English speaking persons or those persons with visual, hearing, or mobility impairments when notified within seven (7) business days prior to the public meeting. Citizens and interested persons are invited to give their comments regarding the use of CDBG, HOME, ESG and HOPWA funds for the proposed Annual Action Plan. The City will arrange for reasonable accommodations for non-English speaking persons or those persons with visual, hearing, or mobility impairments when notified within seven (7) business days prior to the ending of the public comment period. All comments must be received by HCD by 5:00 pm on June 24, 2022. Notice is also given that on Monday, June 27, 2022, at 6:00 p.m. in City Council Chambers on the second floor of City Hall, located at 900 East Broad Street, Richmond VA. The Richmond

City Council will hold a public hearing on the City's proposed 2022-23 Annual Action Plan budget for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), HOME Investment Partnership (HOME), Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG), and Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA) programs. The HOPWA funds are allocated to the City to manage for the Richmond-Petersburg MSA. This meeting will be open to in-person participation. To maximize compliance with the public health guidance aimed at preventing the spread of COVID-19, the public will have the option to provide their comments by teleconference/videoconference via Microsoft Teams, or in writing via email. Interested citizens who wish to take advantage of either option, must do so before 10:00 a.m., on Monday, June 27, 2022, by calling the Office of the City Clerk at (804) 646-7955 and selecting option 3 or sending comments to CityClerksOffice@rva.gov. All written comments received prior to the deadline will be

provided to all members of the Council before the beginning of the meeting and will be included in the record of the meeting.

The Plan serves as a comprehensive planning guide addressing Richmond's community development and housing needs. These needs emphasize the services to be provided to the citizens of the City of Richmond regarding the availability of decent affordable housing, providing a suitable living environment, assisting and the prevention of homelessness, assisting the special needs community, and the expansion of economic opportunities, particularly for low- and moderate-income persons.

The funds below are federal entitlement dollars allocated to the City through the U. S. Department of Housing & Urban Development (HUD) to implement the housing and community development priorities and activities identified in the Five-Year Consolidated Plan, which are consistent with the City's Focus Area Priorities.
