President

The president fulfills **3 major jobs**:

- Head Of State
- Leader of Federal Government
- Commander-In-Chief of the armed forces

Vice President

The Vice President fulfills the role of supporting the President, and potentially takes the position of President, if they are no longer able to serve. They also preside over the Senate, breaking ties in Senate Votes.

The Legislative Branch which is made up of both the Senate and House of Representatives has the primary responsibility of enacting legislation, confirming presidential appointments, and has the ability to declare war. Each state gets two Senators, and the Representatives that a State receives is based directly on population.

9 Justices

The Supreme Court applies the laws created by the legislative branch and enacted by the executive branch to individual cases. They also have a key role in determining the constitutionality of a created law.
