Walmsley Boulevard Sewer Replacement Project


Project Information

The City of Richmond Department of Utilities is planning a project in your area to replace an existing gravity sewer line located along Walmsley Boulevard and Clydewood Avenue. The purpose of this project is to replace and upsize the existing sanitary sewer infrastructure to handle future sanitary flows and growth of the area. This sanitary project requires surveying the area to get an accurate location of the existing utilities and topography, along with geotechnical borings to assist with the design of the new sewer. The City of Richmond has contracted with Brown and Caldwell, Rouse-Sirine and Schnabel to perform this work.

Project Schedule

Work is scheduled to begin in July 2025 and to be completed by the end of September 2025, barring any weather delays or unforeseen circumstances.

During that time, employees from Brown and Caldwell, Rouse-Sirine and Schnabel will be on site to perform the above described work and will maintain a copy of this notice in their possession. During these field activities, any disturbed areas will be restored to like or better conditions.



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Frequently Asked Questions

What is the purpose of this project?

To increase the capacity of the existing sewer to accommodate future sanitary flows from planned growth in the area.

How will this project affect my sewer service, and how will I be notified?

At this time, there will be no sewer impacts. This is survey and geotechnical work only.

Will sidewalks be impacted?

In most cases sidewalks will remain open for pedestrian traffic. If sidewalks or crosswalks need to be closed for public safety, pedestrians will be rerouted to safer pathways of travel.

How will traffic be affected?

Temporary traffic measures may be needed while the survey is conducted within the Right-of-Way to provide safety for the surveyors and vehicular traffic.

How long will the project take?

The survey for this project is scheduled to take three months to complete. Work will be periodic Monday through Friday.

Will trees be removed?

No trees will be removed during the survey and geotechnical work.
