Prison Rape Elimination Act (PREA) Annual Report for July 2025
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The Prison Rape Elimination Act (PREA) requires us, as a juvenile detention facility, to collect accurate, uniform data for every allegation of sexual abuse at our facility using a standardized instrument and set of definitions. This information shall be reported at least annually. The data collected shall include, at a minimum, the data necessary to answer all questions from the most recent version of the Survey of Sexual Violence conducted by the Department of Justice.

The report is approved by the Superintendent and made readily available to the public through our City of Richmond website. There may be some information that is redacted when publication would present a clear and specific threat to the safety and security of a facility, but must indicate the nature of the material redacted.

The Richmond Juvenile Detention Center (RJDC) will maintain sexual abuse data for at least 10 years after the date of its initial collection unless Federal, State, or local law requires otherwise. The report shall include a comparison of the current year's data and corrective actions and shall provide an assessment of RJDC's progress in addressing sexual abuse.

RJDC was audited in April of 2025, by a U. S. Department of Justice-certified PREA auditor, where RJDC met all required standards.

Findings

RJDC received no allegations of sexual assault, staff sexual misconduct, or harassment towards residents in FY25. Since RJDC implemented PREA in 2015, we have had zero incidents as defined by Prison Rape Elimination Act (PREA) of 2003.

The Richmond Juvenile Detention Center strives for a standing zero tolerance policy for sexual abuse and sexual harassment. Our staff is trained in child abuse and neglect reporting, maintaining professional relationships/boundaries, behavior management, code of ethics and more. We are always striving to make our program better and more responsive to our diverse population of residents.
